## **JOIN US IN PRAYER – APRIL 2025**

Week 1:	APRIL 1-4 – PRAY FOR MINISTRIES IN LATIN AMERICA
TUE 1	<b>PRAY</b> for safety and effective ministry during the annual Apoyo "Misión Abordo" (Mission Aboard) this week. Over thirty students from several Latin American countries will board the "Evangelista" river boat in Pucallpa, Peru, and travel along the Ucayali River. These students have a passion for missions. Each morning, they will receive biblical training in missions and cross-cultural communication, and each afternoon they will visit a different community to share the Gospel. A medical team will also hold clinics in each community.
WED 2	<b>PRAISE</b> God that Project Bless, a new multi-story major addition to Hospital Vozandes Quito, is proceeding according to plan. In March, the physical therapy service moved to the first floor, and more outpatient services will be moving in the months ahead. Pray for the spiritual growth of the many construction workers who have made commitments to Christ during this project.
тн <b>и</b> 3	<b>PRAY</b> for the community ministries team as they prepare to do a medical caravan to Kurintza with the national health service later this month. The team will also install toilet and water facilities at the national health service facility there to encourage the placement of a government-sponsored physician to provide on-site health services long-term. We pray that our team will be a witness to the national health service team as well as to the community, and an encouragement to other believers in the area.
FRI 4	<b>PRAY</b> for the run-off presidential election that will take place in Ecuador on April 13th between Daniel Noboa and Luisa González. Pray for peace and for the Lord's will to be done.
sat & sun <b>5-6</b>	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS   Adi Andhra Country: India   Population: 345,000   Language: Telegu   Main Religion: Hinduism   Evangelical: 0.43% The Adi Andhra are the original inhabitants of Andhra Pradesh in South India. As a Scheduled Caste, the Adi Andhra are provided with guaranteed placement in education and public jobs since they have been victims of past discrimination. As of 2001, only about 60% of the Adi Andhra could read and write at a basic level. Today most Adi Andhra are still landless rural farm workers. Some also work as street sweepers, village watchmen, and in the leather trade. The Adi Andhra give attention to the Hindu goddesses who they believe can protect them from epidemics, evil spirits, and famine. Pray that they would come to know the one true God who can give them physical and spiritual healing.
Week 2:	APRIL 7-11 – PRAY FOR MINISTRIES IN SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA
мо <b>N</b> 7	<b>PRAY</b> for Joseph and Benjamin as they give training to 15 Christian media workers in Nairobi, Kenya this week. The five-day Training of Trainers course will equip these believers with materials, skills, and strategies to train others to more effectively use radio and digital media to share the Gospel. Ask God to protect each one as they travel, and for His presence throughout the week.
TUE 8	<b>PRAISE</b> God for Wim and Alfred's recent trip to our well partner ministry in Benin. Praise God for their conversations with one of the communities, that is ready to embrace and provide the extra work and finances it will cost them to install a solar pump and potable water distribution system, removing the need for a hand-pump well.
WED 9	<b>PRAISE</b> God for an up-and-coming French-speaking trainer who we sponsored to give two weeks of training to a gathering of radio ministries in Central Africa. She was especially thankful for the materials and resources we provided, but also amazed at how God was able to use her to transfer knowledge and "transform the minds" of the 30+ participants.
тн <b>и</b> 10	<b>PRAY</b> for our engineers Alfred and Alex as they investigate options for relocating a transmitter in Sierra Leone to improve its reliability and coverage. The process has been accelerated after a car ran into their tower. Praise God they are back on the air.
FRI 11	<b>PRAISE</b> God for the successful delivery of an online training course that focused on script writing. Praise God for the responses from participants who described the content as eye-opening and very useful for their ministries.
sat & sun 12-13	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS   Oromo Garre Country: Kenya   Population: 804,000   Language: Garre   Main Religion: Islam   Evangelical: 0.01% The Garre are a sub-tribe of a much larger ethnic group known as the Somali and those living in Kenya are concentrated mainly in the Wajir and Mandera districts. Most of the Garre are nomadic herders who live in portable huts made of bent saplings covered with animal skins or woven mats. Garre villages are made up of several related families and women live in separate huts. The Somali tribes were converted to Islam in the 1400s. Today, the Garre are virtually all Sunni Muslims. They are very orthodox in their religious practices. In recent years, the northeastern regions of Africa have suffered from severe drought. Healthcare facilities are also insufficient to meet the needs of the people. Pray that God would send workers to the Garre to meet their physical and spiritual needs.
Week 3:	APRIL 14-18 – PRAY FOR MINISTRIES IN NORTH AFRICA/MIDDLE EAST
мон 14	<b>PRAY</b> for our upcoming media training in May that will include Arabic-speaking believers. Pray that it will be a time of equipping, encouragement, and building of relationships. Ask God to show each participant how He wants to use them to share the Gospel.

тие 15	<b>PRAY</b> for Ephraim Project team members as they train new volunteers to use social media to build friendships with people so they can share the Good News of Jesus. Pray that God would give all of our volunteers wisdom as they engage with people who are often going through very difficult circumstances. Pray that the hope we have in Jesus would be clearly visible.
wed 16	<b>PRAISE</b> God for the successful relocation of some equipment into one of our studios that improves the way that we can do live radio and our engagement with local listeners. Ask God to continue to guide each of our program producers at Radio Vida as they seek to create content that meets the heartfelt needs of our listeners.
тни 17	<b>PRAISE</b> God for giving Robbyn the wonderful opportunity to share at a four-day missions conference in Texas. Give thanks that she was able to tell the congregation about the challenges of reaching the unreached and share how God is using Reach Beyond to proclaim and demonstrate the Gospel to unreached people everywhere.
FRI 18	<b>PRAY</b> that God would send more people to serve in Spain and the North Africa/Middle East region. Pray for the Lord's leading as our team speaks with several people who have expressed interest in serving in the region. Ask God to make His will known.
sat & sun <b>19-20</b>	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS   Algerian Tuareg Country: Algeria   Population: 78,000   Language: Arabic (Algerian Saharan)   Main Religion: Islam   Evangelical: 0.01% The Algerian Tuareg live on the northern edge of the Sahara Desert in central Algeria. As descendants of slave traders, they remain despised by certain people groups. The majority of Algerian Tuareg live a more settled life in the fertile regions unlike the nomadic desert lifestyle of other Tuareg. Their daily meals consist of dairy products such as milk, yogurt or rice covered in ghee (butter). Out of a need for money or better living conditions, some have taken up manual labor jobs, though they despise this type of work. The Algerian Tuareg are Maliki Muslims—one of the four major schools of Sunni Islam. Pray for the Holy Spirit to open their hearts to the Gospel. Pray for the Lord to raise up people willing to live among the Algerian Tuareg and be a witness for Christ among them.
Week 4:	APRIL 21-25 – PRAY FOR MINISTRIES IN ASIA/PACIFIC
мо <b>л</b> 21	<b>PRAY</b> for Rachel as she talks about God with the young women that she is befriending from an unreached people group. Ask God to give her opportunities to share about Jesus through everyday conversations, prayers, and telling stories from the Bible.
TUE 22	<b>PRAY</b> for five partner radio stations in Indonesia as they work to become more self-sustainable. Ask God to provide for their needs in amazing and wonderful ways. Pray that each station would thrive, and that God would grow their ministry.
WED 23	<b>PRAISE</b> God for a local volunteer who is helping with leading and teaching at one of our learning centers in the region. Ask God to help her learn the heart language of the unreached people group we are trying to reach. Praise God for a conversation with one of the parents, who insisted that the learning center be open more days each week because his kids need school.
тн <b>∪</b> 24	<b>PRAISE</b> God for the new tower and transmitter for a radio station in central Indonesia. This new equipment will double the reach of the Gospel in a very dark city. Ask God to encourage the staff and fill them with joy as they share the hope they have in Jesus.
FRI 25	<b>PRAY</b> that God would call more workers out into the harvest in the Asia/Pacific region. Ask God to send us people with a heart to serve at our learning centers and other ministries among unreached people. Pray that God would also provide us with more radio trainers, broadcast engineers, and radio technicians.
sat & sun 26-27	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS   Cham Country: Cambodia   Population: 258,000   Language: Western Cham   Main Religion: Islam   Evangelical: 0.01% For almost a millennium, the Cham ruled the Champa Kingdom—a fusion of Malayo-Polynesian and Indian cultures—in south-central Vietnam. In 1471, Champa was conquered by the Vietnamese, and most nobles and freemen escaped to Cambodia. The Cham thrived in Cambodia until the civil war began in 1969 and the Khmer Rouge began targeting the Western Cham for being Muslims. Hundreds of thousands died. Today, they often work as farmers, fishermen, boat builders, and shopkeepers, but most are extremely poor. Most Cham homes are simple, sparse, and have a feeling of impermanence. They often have enough food to eat but have very few possessions. Ask God to raise up and equip faithful Christians to reach the Cham. Praise Him for a Cham Bible. Pray that He would strengthen and grow the tiny Cham church. Pray for believers to share the Gospel and help meet their practical needs.
Week 5:	APRIL 28-30 – PRAY FOR HCJB IN ECUADOR
мон 28	<b>PRAY</b> for HCJB in Quito and their applications for three new FM repeater stations in the provinces of Imbabura, Sucumbios, and the city of Baños. These are all places where people have asked for HCJB to establish an FM radio station. We praise God that the opportunity to apply for these locations finally came, and we are excited to see what God might do.
tue <b>29</b>	<b>PRAISE</b> God for new video productions that HCJB is beginning this year with Bible Project and other ministries. Over the last few years, internet video has become more of what we do, and we are thankful for the talented people who are part of this ministry.
WED 30	<b>PRAY</b> for HCJB2 as they await the results of their frequency renewal application. We are hoping to get a 15-year license to continue covering the province of Guayas, Ecuador with the main station and the province of El Oro with a repeater. Since the FM dial is full in Guayaquil (Guayas Province), it is not guaranteed that HCJB2 will be able to continue on our current frequency, as others have applied for it too. Pray that God's will would be done, and that our frequencies would be renewed.
