Week 1:	FEB 1-6 – PRAY FOR MINISTRIES IN CENTRAL ASIA
tues 1	PRAISE God for the two missionary doctors who joined the team this past year. Praise God for the new friendships that they have made and the deepening of these relationships. Pray for them as they navigate cultural, language, and medical barriers, especially Dr. H as she volunteers at a hospice.
WED 2	PRAY for N as she hosts a Valentine's Day luncheon on February 9 for all women staff at the medical clinic. N will be preparing to share a parable, music, and a craft. Not all of the staff are believers and this is an opportunity to share the love of Christ through this event. Pray for N as she also prepares a one-day Valentine's Day conference on February 26th, titled "My Heart," for alumni medical residents and current clinic staff. Pray that the programs and people come together easily and that God's presence is super strong each day.
тни 3	PRAY for the new family medicine residents who are on rotation at the medical clinic. Pray that these medical residents would see Jesus through the missionary workers who are providing clinical training.
FRI 4	PRAISE God that the remodeling project of a new medical clinic in the region has gone well. Pray that the Lord would provide the staff (both local and missionary) to run the clinic. Pray that the government license to run the clinic would be approved quickly and easily.
sat & sun 5-6	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UPGs PRAY for the Jogi Country: India Population: 3.2 million Language: Bengali Main Religion: Hinduism Evangelical: 0.00% The Jogi are a people group who practice yoga as part of their daily routine. Jogi is the colloquial term for yogi. The Jogi were originally a community that over time formed into a caste. They worship the Hindu god Shiva and follow the yoga belief system where they seek to attain complete union with the supreme being. They traditionally wear saffron colored clothing which indicates they are followers of yoga. Many have taken on a lifestyle of religious begging, relying on charity to survive. Others earn a living through fortune telling, divination, or practicing exorcism. Pray that they would recognize Jesus as the Supreme Being and they would give their life to following Him as the one True Lord. Pray for them to have open hearts to receive the Gospel and the freedom that is found in Christ. Pray that they would be freed from the beggar mentality and would have viable employment opportunities.
Week 2:	FEB 7-13 – PRAY FOR REACH BEYOND LEADERSHIP
мо л 7	PRAISE God for the team of leaders that He has brought together at this appointed time to give direction and support to Reach Beyond ministries around the world. Praise God for how He has uniquely prepared and equipped each leader.
TUES 8	PRAY for the leaders who are meeting together in Colorado Springs this week. Pray for the Holy Spirit to give them wisdom and counsel during discussions and for unity as they make decisions. Pray for the Lord's guidance as the leadership team seeks to fulfill God's purposes in proclaiming and demonstrating the Gospel to all the nations.
WED 9	PRAY for the leadership team as they work together, pray together, and encourage each other. Pray that the love they have for each other would continue to grow and that God would use it to demonstrate His love to the world.
тн и 10	PRAY for President Daniel Enns and Vice Presidents Roger Basick and Dave Jolly as they continue to walk with the Lord and seek Him in prayer together. Pray that God will strengthen them and help them in the midst of unknowns and challenges as they guide and equip their teams for works of service.
fri 11	PRAISE God for the opportunity for the leadership team and the Colorado office staff to be still before the Lord at a prayer retreat today. Pray that God will strengthen and encourage our missionaries, staff, and ministry partners around the world. Pray that God would continue to use Reach Beyond to make disciples and that Jesus would be exalted in all nations of the world.
sat & sun 12-13	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UPGs PRAY for the Tabasaran Country: Russia Population: 152,000 Language: Tabasaran Main Religion: Islam Evangelical: 0.08% The Tabsaran people live in Dagestan, along the Caspian Sea in the southernmost part of Russia. The majority of the population live in 99 villages in the region while others live in some urban centers. They claim to be "the most hospitable of all Dagestani people" as friendship and hospitality are among their highest values. If a person has many friends, they are considered to be wealthy. Their culture is based on mutual aid in day-to-day life, respect for elders, and societal care for the sick and poor. The Tabasaran have a collective male decision making council at the center of each village that helps make village decisions. Male drunkenness is a prevalent problem as well as cycles of violence and vengeance. Pray for the Tabasaran to open their hearts to Jesus and to receive His hospitality to the Kingdom of God. Pray for the Holy Spirit to bring transformation to their villages, that they would turn from their drunkenness and wicked ways, and seek forgiveness.

Week 3:	FEB 14-20 – PRAY FOR THE NEW ZEALAND OFFICE
мол 14	PRAISE God for the incredible response to the SuperBible comics, especially in restricted access countries.
тие 15	PRAY for opportunities for staff in New Zealand to be able to visit churches and share the work of Reach Beyond even as COVID-19 restrictions change on how many people can gather together.
wed 16	PRAY for more staff members for the New Zealand office. They are in need of people willing to serve God in their field of expertise, especially with technical skills and mobile app development.
тн и 17	PRAISE God for Sheep Stations being deployed throughout Africa and South America which allow many people to not only access the internet, but also the Gospel.
FRI 18	PRAY for Russell Grainger as he continues to lead the New Zealand office and for the staff as they faithfully support various projects to engage the unreached.
sat & sun 19-20	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UPGs PRAY for the Qizilbash Country: Afghanistan Population: 306,000 Language: Dari Main Religion: Islam Evangelical: 0.00% The Qizilbash are descendants from the Azeri Turk tribe that originated in the regions of Anatolia and Azerbaijan. The Qizilbash came into Afghanistan in 1738, when they were serving as troops during the India campaign of Iranian ruler Nadir Shah Afshar. Today the Qizilbash live in the major urban centers as well as in the villages of central Afghanistan. They are craftsmen and tradesmen who have historically held important roles in government and continue to have important political influence on society. They adhere to Twelver Shia Islam as taught by sheikhs Haydar and his son Isma'il. They believe that their rulers are divine beings; thus, other orthodox Shias would consider them to be extremists. Pray for laborers to come and serve among the Qizilbash and to stand in the gap and intercede for their people. Pray that they would see that Jesus is Lord—the one true King and that He would be exalted among them. Pray for a strong local church to be planted among the Qizilbash people.
Week 4:	FEB 21-27 – PRAY FOR SHARE ENGLISH MINISTRIES
мол 21	PRAISE God that the Share English listeners' website consistently has more traffic than last year and for the growth of Middle East users.
TUE 22	PRAY for Share English club leaders around the world who lead English conversation clubs either locally or online. Pray that in the continuing difficult times of the pandemic, they will not tire nor be worn down by stress, no matter where in the world they live.
WED 23	PRAY for the Share English club leaders to experience joy in their club as they share the love of Jesus, and that their faithfulness in helping club members to improve their English will be rewarded by a plentiful harvest.
тни 24	PRAY for those who attend Share English clubs. Pray that their interactions with others in the group and with the club leaders would open doors for spiritual conversations. Pray that as groups discuss themes like love during the month of February, that English learners would start to seek the Heavenly Father who loves them.
FRI 25	PRAISE God that more young people are listening to the programs (40% of the audience are aged 18-24) and pray that the hearts of these young people will be made receptive to Jesus.
SAT & SUN 26-27	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UPGs PRAY for the Gola Country: Liberia Population: 177,000 Language: Gola Main Religion: Islam Evangelical: 0.82% The Gola are skilled farmers who live in the rural areas of western Liberia. They grow rice, yams, peanuts, and taro. The entire family works together in raising the crops; men cultivate the land, women and children plant the seeds, boys keep the animals and birds away from the fields, and girls winnow the rice. Gola celebrations center around agriculture including the yam and peanut harvests. While the Gola are mostly Muslim, many still practice ancestor worship. For example, in a season of drought, the village elder will pray to a god called Da while holding the skull of an ancestor. He will sacrifice an animal and pour the blood over the skull. They believe that when someone dies, he or she is reincarnated and born into the family of either the mother or father. Pray for the Gola to recognize the one true God who created the heavens and the earth and is Lord over the rain and the crops. Pray that they see Jesus is the one true sacrifice that takes away their sin as well as provides for all of their needs. Pray for believers in Liberia to be bold and share the Gospel with their unreached neighbors.
Week 5:	FEB 28-MAR 6 – PRAY FOR CHURCH PARTNERSHIPS
мон 28	PRAISE God for each church that partners together with Reach Beyond in prayer, finances, and people to be a part of proclaiming and demonstrating the Good News of Jesus around the world.
