

## JOIN US IN PRAYER – FEBRUARY 2026

Week 1: FEBRUARY 2-6 – PRAY FOR MINISTRIES IN SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA	
MON 2	<b>PRAISE</b> God for the unexpected granting of a license for a new radio station in an area that is hostile to the Gospel. Our partners have been praying for this license for over eight years. Praise God that we were able to supply equipment for the station and send a ministry partner to set up the station which is now on the air. Pray that many would respond to the Good News of Jesus.
TUE 3	<b>PRAY</b> for our indigenous partners in West Africa who are using clean water wells to help plant churches in unreached communities. Pray for God's provision of a drilling rig that they can use for this ministry, which will greatly increase the number of wells they can install and communities they can reach with the Gospel.
WED 4	<b>PRAISE</b> God that we were able to greatly expand the reach of African Bible College's radio station in Liberia. Reach Beyond helped them launch this small station back in 2011, which had a broadcast range of about nine miles. Now the station's broadcasts reach over 90 miles, including into Guinea and the Ivory Coast. The university has asked us to come teach their students so they can increase the Gospel impact of the station.
THU 5	<b>PRAY</b> for the radio station staff who participated in our training last month on politics. Ask God to give them wisdom as they face incredible pressure from local and national politicians. Pray that God will help them demonstrate Christ by being a reliable and trusted source of information. Pray that they will also be able to serve as peacemakers in the midst of turmoil and division.
FRI 6	<b>PRAISE</b> God for a new radio station in Liberia launched by Joseph Kebbie, who is a long-time member of our radio training team. Our engineer Alfred helped Joseph with the setup of the station, which is now sharing the Gospel with unreached peoples living in Liberia, Sierra Leone, and Guinea.
SAT & SUN 7-8	<b>WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS   Maasina Fulani</b> <b>Country:</b> Mali   <b>Population:</b> 1,560,000   <b>Language:</b> Fulfulde, Maasina   <b>Main Religion:</b> Islam   <b>Evangelical:</b> 0.0-0.1% The Fula Maasina are much like the Fulani peoples found throughout West Africa. They are largely agricultural-based, raising cattle along with sheep and goats. They farm crops like millet, rice, and peanuts. Fula Maasina villages or communities are typically scattered but include a center court, a mosque, and often an Islamic school. They are very devoted to Islam and view it as part of their identity. The Fula Maasina are very resistant to Christianity as they fear that it will divide their families. Pray that God would open the eyes and hearts of family and village leaders so they would see the truth. Pray for more believers and workers to live among them. Pray that the Fula Maasina would recognize Jesus as their Savior and that they would choose to follow Him.
Week 2: FEBRUARY 9-13 – PRAY FOR MINISTRIES IN EUROPE/EURASIA	
MON 9	<b>PRAISE</b> God for the five Christmas and New Year celebrations that were held for five different groups from one community. Each celebration was tailored to the needs and spiritual level of that group. There were games, presents, Gospel presentations, and challenges to read the Bible for themselves in the New Year. Pray for the teams who are engaged with each group as they pray and plan for the year ahead. Pray that God would draw each person closer to Him, and that all would choose to follow Jesus.
TUE 10	<b>PRAY</b> for the international school in Central Asia as they look for new, dedicated, Christ-filled teachers to join a wonderful community of workers who are pouring into the lives of very special kids. Pray for Rusty and Rose as they continue to teach at the school and minister to families who are helping to share Good News in a place that desperately needs Him.
WED 11	<b>PRAISE</b> God for a local physician in a restrictive country who wants to be trained in physical therapy. Pray for her as she works to complete her government training, and that she will be able to start serving with our team soon.
THU 12	<b>PRAY</b> for two Reach Beyond missionaries who are serving on the advisory board of partner ministry One Heart in Greece. Praise God for providing a dental chair for the growing medical clinic, which shares Jesus and provides compassionate care to immigrants and refugees from the Middle East.
FRI 13	<b>PRAY</b> for the palliative care ministry, which is nearing the end as a one-year pilot project. Pray for refreshed vision and renewed permissions from government officials to operate. Praise God for the relationships that the team has made in the community as well as at the local fellowship.
SAT & SUN 14-15	<b>WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS   Kumyk</b> <b>Country:</b> Russia   <b>Population:</b> 564,000   <b>Language:</b> Kumyk   <b>Main Religion:</b> Islam   <b>Evangelical:</b> 0.0-0.1% The Kumyk are one of only two Turkic-language people groups in Dagestan (southern Russia). They farm, tend vineyards, and raise cattle on the fertile Kumyk Plateau by the Caspian Sea. They are a proud, respected people who once held major political influence in the region. Their art, dance, folk music, and weddings present a unique fusion of cultural and religious traditions. Once a Christian people, the Kumyk have been Sunni Muslims since the 9th century. They rarely marry outsiders, and they see large families as a blessing from Allah. Islam is integral to Kumyk identity, although they tend to mix folk religion into their practice. They see Christianity as a Russian religion, which makes it unsafe for the tiny Kumyk church to exist publicly. Pray for boldness and safety for Kumyk believers. Ask God to open the hearts of Kumyk elders and leaders to hear and receive the Gospel.

Week 3:	FEBRUARY 16-20 – PRAY FOR MINISTRIES IN NORTH AFRICA/MIDDLE EAST
MON 16	<b>PRAY</b> for the Ephraim Project team and especially for the Persian-speaking people they have been engaging with in conversations and discipling. Pray that in the midst of current unrest, uncertainty, and difficulties that are affecting them, God would open many more doors for us to share the hope of Jesus with them.
TUE 17	<b>PRAISE</b> God for the completion of the major concrete work for the new radiation therapy building at the Mbingo Baptist Hospital in Cameroon. Electrical and mechanical installations still need to be completed, but this is a major milestone. Pray for God to supply the additional funds needed to complete the project.
WED 18	<b>PRAY</b> for our team as they plan for a potential media training session in the region for believers from North Africa and the Middle East. Pray that God would help arrange all of the logistics and bring together the people He wants us to train.
THU 19	<b>PRAY</b> that God would send more workers to serve in Spain and the North Africa/Middle East Region. Ask God to give our team wisdom as they work on succession planning, and please pray for discernment as they consider future ministry in the region.
FRI 20	<b>PRAY</b> for God's wisdom in resolving some technical challenges with the plastic injection molding machine at the Trash 2 Treasure installation in Athens. Pray for our partners who desire to use this ministry to demonstrate how Jesus can restore brokenness and make something totally new.
SAT & SUN 21-22	<p><b>WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS   Mazanderani</b></p> <p><b>Country:</b> Iran   <b>Population:</b> 1,419,000   <b>Language:</b> Mazanderani   <b>Main Religion:</b> Islam   <b>Evangelical:</b> 0.1-2.0%</p> <p>The Mazanderani live in northern Iran along the Caspian Sea coast, a region of marshy plains that give way to highlands farther inland. The region has been invaded multiple times throughout the centuries. They are an ethnic mix of Turkic tribes, Armenians, and Russian immigrants. Although closely connected to Farsi, the Mazandarani language has never been put into written form, creating a roadblock to cultural and spiritual growth. Many Mazanderani raise crops and cattle. They are famous for their Arabian horses. Pray for doors to open for Christian teachers to serve this people group. Ask God to open the hearts of Iran's government leaders to allow access to the Gospel. Pray for the completion of an audio Mazandarani Bible.</p>
Week 4:	FEBRUARY 23-27 – PRAY FOR MINISTRIES IN ASIA PACIFIC
MON 23	<b>PRAISE</b> God for the opportunity to encourage a group of pastors and provide radio training to a media partner in a closed country. Pray for wisdom as our team continues to seek God's leading for next steps in this ministry project opportunity.
TUE 24	<b>PRAY</b> for Anita as she goes to a partner radio station in Indonesia to mentor the station manager and provide training to some new volunteers. Pray for this station and many other ones that have a big heart for reaching their communities with the Gospel, but little resources to work with. Pray we can help them discover and implement strategies to become more self-sustaining.
WED 25	<b>PRAISE</b> God for the provision of six tablets for our Haven Leaning Center that ministers to the Rohingya people. Pray as we train two new volunteers who will be helping with the tablet class. Pray that this ministry would continue to open the hearts of the Rohingya community to the Gospel.
THU 26	<b>PRAY</b> that God would send more workers to join us in the region, as our team is feeling really stretched. Pray for our technical team as they have had to move the Asia Pacific media workshop to another place. Pray for God's strength as they set up the new space while continuing the ministry. Pray that God would bless this new space and that He would use it for His glory.
FRI 27	<b>PRAISE</b> God for the two national believers from Indonesia and Thailand who serve as valuable members of our technical support and radio training team. Pray for them as they both are currently experiencing health struggles. Ask God to give them healing. Pray that they would see God at work in the midst of their situation.
SAT & SUN 28-1	<p><b>WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS   Sylheti Muslim</b></p> <p><b>Country:</b> Bangladesh   <b>Population:</b> 12,535,000   <b>Language:</b> Sylheti   <b>Main Religion:</b> Islam   <b>Evangelical:</b> 0.0-0.1%</p> <p>The Sylhet are Muslims from Bangladesh's Sylhet region and Northeast India who combine Muslim and Hindu wedding customs. Although Islam does not recognize castes, Sylheti Muslims practice a system of social division. Every year, the Sylhet community celebrates certain Islamic holidays. They give their children money, and the men offer special Islamic prayers. They visit relatives later in the day and cook traditional food. As Muslims, they usually hear at an early age that the Bible is filled with inaccuracies and the Koran is flawless. There is much social pressure to remain within the Islamic fold. It is very difficult to break into the Sylhet community. Believers must spend much time in fervent prayer before sending someone to tell them about the one and only Savior. Pray that God would open their hearts to hearing the word of the Lord. Ask God to speak to their hearts and pray that they would respond and choose to joyfully follow Jesus.</p>

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
