

JOIN US IN PRAYER – JULY 2024

Week 1:	JULY 1-5 – PRAY FOR MINISTRIES IN ASIA PACIFIC
MON 1	PRAY for our team members as they join with other believers to launch a pilot program offering housing and employment opportunities to abused/abandoned Rohingya women. Ask God to give them wisdom as they work through the logistics of this project. Pray that the Rohingya women would experience peace and safety and would discover God's love through this program.
TUE 2	PRAISE God for the recent training given to over 20 radio station managers in a Southeast Asian country. The attendees were encouraged by what they learned and the fellowship with each other. Ask God to multiply the ministry impact of these stations.
WED 3	PRAY for our new educational center for displaced women and children. Pray for our team and partners as they try to make peace with some of the neighbors in the apartment complex. Pray that this center would help bring the community closer together.
THU 4	PRAISE God for granting Trevor new opportunities to serve more radio stations in Southeast Asia. Give thanks for several people who have recently helped him with technical projects and repairing numerous radio transmitters. Pray that God would provide more full-time technical help for the region.
FRI 5	PRAISE God that Rachel's language skills have advanced to the point where she is able to begin translating a Bible storybook into Rohingya. Pray for God's grace as she works on this challenging project.
SAT & SUN 6-7	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS Enim Country: Indonesia Population: 140,000 Language: Central Malay Main Religion: Islam Evangelical: 0.01% The Enim people live along a section of the Trans-Sumatra Highway bordering the Ogan people group. Many Enim earn a living by collecting sand and rocks from riverbeds, harvesting firewood, or tapping rubber trees. The Enim practice Islam mixed with traditional animistic beliefs. They easily intermingle with people from different ethnic and religious backgrounds which creates more opportunities for Christians to engage with them. Pray that the Enim people would come to know more Jesus followers. Pray for their immediate physical needs, including better access to education, electricity, and water. Pray that God would open their hearts to the Gospel message and give them a hunger for the Truth.
Week 2:	JULY 8-12 – PRAY FOR REACH BEYOND AUSTRALIA
MON 8	PRAY for the team in Kununurra as they serve at our broadcast facility in North West Australia. Pray for safety and wisdom as they work on maintaining the facility and antennas and allocate tasks to the many volunteers who help out during the "dry season" of May through September.
TUE 9	PRAY for the Lord's guidance and protection as our local partners in the Himalayas are about to start the distribution of a batch of MP3 players and shortwave radios in the region.
WED 10	PRAISE God for the growing internet ministry that He has given our team in recent years that is reaching people who would not normally listen to our shortwave radio broadcasts. Pray that many more people would decide to follow Jesus through this ministry.
THU 11	PRAY for the safety of our three local media production teams in Myanmar. They have been diligently producing programs and engaging listeners despite the instability and violence in that country.
FRI 12	PRAISE God for our dedicated radio program producers who are located all throughout Asia Pacific. Ask God to give them creativity and wisdom as they prepare content in 24 languages, which we broadcast from Australia into the region.
SAT & SUN 13-14	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS Rai Country: Nepal Population: 726,000 Language: Nepali Main Religion: other Evangelical: unknown The Rai constitute the largest ethnic group in eastern Nepal. They live in thatched-roof houses, and most farm rice and other crops using traditional agricultural methods. They are known as courageous people, and many have joined the military to escape economic hardship. They speak several dialects of Kiranti, a Tibeto-Burman language, although most also speak Nepali. Although influenced by both Buddhism and Hinduism, the Rai retain their traditional religion, worshiping local deities and common ancestors. Proselytizing is illegal in Nepal, and families make it difficult for people to accept Christ. Pray for safety among Christians in Nepal. Pray that the Lord of the Harvest would send bold witnesses to the Rai and that many new believers would come to faith.

Week 3:	JULY 15-19 – PRAY FOR MINISTRIES IN SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA
MON 15	PRAY for our team as they prepare to give a Training of Trainers course to an overflowing class in Tanzania this August. The course will equip Christian media workers to effectively train and empower others using their own skills and experience.
TUE 16	PRAY for our Sub-Saharan Africa team as they participate in the Africa by Radio media conference in Tanzania. Pray for our staff as they engage with many of our partners. Give thanks that our whole team will be able to spend some time together.
WED 17	PRAISE God for the solar power installation that Alfred oversaw at a partner station in Togo. The new solar power system will reduce operating costs and allow the station to broadcast reliably for more hours every day. Pray that God would protect each piece of equipment and that He would greatly multiply the ministry impact of this station.
THU 18	PRAY for the team as we prepare to start multiple new radio station projects in the near future. Ask God to give them discernment and wisdom to overcome any challenges that these projects face.
FRI 19	PRAY for God to provide the necessary funding to deliver all the in-person training that we have planned for the rest of the year. In-person training is the key to the development and growth of our partner ministries.
SAT & SUN 20-21	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS Lak Country: Iran Population: 1,322,000 Language: Laki Main Religion: Islam Evangelical: 0.00% Once a warlike, nomadic tribe of shepherds, the Lak now live in the Zagros Mountains of western Iran. They closely identify with the neighboring Lur people, but the similarities between the Laki and Kurdish languages suggest a common ancestry between the two groups. Like many Iranians, the Lak practice mystical Shiite Islam, but they also incorporate elements of Yarsanism, a fusion of Shiite Islam and Zoroastrianism. Due to their own history of persecution, Shiite Muslims believe that unrighteous men can kill a righteous one, making Christ's death less of a stumbling block to them than to Sunnis. Pray that the Lak would develop a deep hunger and thirst for Jesus, the Righteous One. Ask God to send bold Iranian Christians to start a church planting movement among them.
Week 4:	JULY 22-26 – PRAY FOR MINISTRIES IN EUROPE/EURASIA
MON 22	PRAY for peace in the region. Pray that God would bring an end to the war and the pain it is causing. Pray for our brothers and sisters in Christ who are caught in the midst of it all. Ask God to meet their needs. Pray that they would be able to help others find refuge in God, our Rock, our Fortress, and our Deliverer.
TUE 23	PRAY for our ministry partners who are serving faithfully throughout the former Soviet Union. Ask God to encourage and strengthen them as they continue to proclaim the Good News despite government pressure and financial needs.
WED 24	PRAISE God for providing new teammates to serve in a closed country. Pray for our team as they help them settle into this place and make it their home. Pray that they new missionaries will adjust well and that their ministry will be fruitful.
THU 25	PRAY for our missionaries and ministry partners as they faithfully continue serving during the summer, a traditional period of vacation and downtime in Europe/Eurasia. Pray that God would encourage them by opening new doors for ministry.
FRI 26	PRAY for the medical caravan team as they return to the same isolated area where they held a clinic two years ago. Pray that the team will be an encouragement to the few local believers who came to faith through the outreach there. Pray that more would choose to follow Jesus and that God would establish a local church or home group in that area.
SAT & SUN 27-28	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS Tuvan Country: Russia Population: 294,000 Language: Tuvan Main Religion: Buddhism Evangelical: 0.19% The Tuvan, a Turkic people, live in a mountainous region of southern Siberia near the border of Mongolia, a dry, extreme climate. Summer temperatures can hit 110 degrees Fahrenheit, and winter can see temperatures below -75 degrees. The Tuvan lived as nomadic shepherds under Mongolian rule until 1911. Independent Tuva joined the Soviet Union in 1944. Today, most Tuvan still raise livestock, supplementing their livelihood by hunting and farming grains and vegetables. Oral epic poems and fermented mare's milk are hallmarks of Tuvan culture. Sadly, illiteracy, divorce, and abortion are common. Most Tuvan practice a shamanistic form of Buddhism. Pray for God to soften their hearts toward the Gospel. Pray for Christians to meet practical needs that open doors to share the Good News of Jesus. Ask the Light of the World to reveal Himself to the Tuvan.
Week 5:	JULY 29-31 – PRAY FOR REACH BEYOND MISSIONARIES AND STAFF
MON 29	PRAY for our missionaries who are having to navigate the challenges and complexities of obtaining and maintaining visas in the countries where they serve. Ask God to grant them favor with government officials and that their visas would be approved.
TUE 30	PRAY for our missionary kids. Pray for those who are traveling with their parents during home ministry assignment. Ask God to give them grace in every situation. Pray that each of our missionary kids would grow strong in their faith and their walk with God.
WED 31	PRAY for our Member Care team as they minister to our missionaries. Ask God to help them encourage and support our missionaries on the field as they navigate the unique highs and lows of full-time ministry and family life in a cross-cultural context.
