Week 1:	JULY 1-3 – PRAY FOR MINISTRIES IN SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA
WED 1	PRAY for our media trainers as they teach live online sessions to radio and media ministries throughout the continent. Pray for those who participated in a recent course designed to help them become more effective in their on-air evangelism efforts.
THU 2	PRAY for Wim and Emmanuel as they go to Sierra Leone this month to give WASH training (Water Access, Sanitation, and Hygiene) to the staff of one of our partner radio stations, as well as a community to which the station broadcasts. Pray that God would use this training to help many more people discover the Good News of Jesus and choose to follow Him.
FRI 3	PRAY for our finance team as they diligently work to correctly navigate all of the requirements, challenges, and pitfalls involved with banking in Sub-Saharan Africa. Please pray for God to provide all that is needed—people, resources, and funding—for each of the ministry projects we are pursuing in this region.
SAT & SUN 4-5	<p>WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS Fulbe Futa Country: Guinea Population: 4,979,000 Language: Pular Main Religion: Islam Evangelical: 0.0-0.1%</p> <p>The Fulbe Futa are a semi-nomadic people who also raise livestock and crops. They are a subgroup of the vast Fulani people group who live across West Africa and the Sahel. While the majority of Fulani raise “humped” cattle, the Fulbe Futa raise a native Djallon breed that is resistant to the tsetse fly, which is notorious for carrying disease. While herding cattle is typically a male activity, milking is done by women, who also care for the cattle, poultry, and other small livestock, and cultivate their gardens. The Fulbe Futa live in beehive-shaped huts that are surrounded by a cattle corral. While the homes in the villages are spread out, there is a central court and mosque. The Fulbe Futa are devout Muslims, and some villages have Islamic schools for their children. Pray for a willingness for the Fulbe Futa to learn about Jesus and His teachings and open their hearts to His truths.</p>
Week 2:	JULY 6-10 – PRAY FOR MINISTRIES IN ASIA PACIFIC
MON 6	PRAY for Trevor and our Indonesian partners this week as they install an electrical grounding system at a radio station. Pray too for God’s help as Trevor will be working to troubleshoot and repair several transmitters that are not working as they should.
TUE 7	PRAISE God for a recent conference in Thailand that provided valuable insight into discovering ways we can better collaborate with others in ministry. Pray for productive follow-up meetings in Indonesia as we seek how God would have us better serve alongside local believers and partner ministries to share the Good News of Jesus.
WED 8	PRAY for the new coordinator of the network of Christian radio stations that we have been partnering with in Thailand. Ask God to give them wisdom as they encourage, lead, and serve others who want to use radio to reach all of this country with the Gospel.
THU 9	PRAY for our team as they hope to soon begin work on translating, voicing, and producing animated “SuperBible” Bible story videos in the Bahasa Indonesia language. Pray that God would provide the finances needed for this project.
FRI 10	PRAY for Janice as she edits a new series of short videos to help Indonesian radio presenters understand how to use their broadcast software better. Pray that God will give her creativity and focus during each step of production.
SAT & SUN 11-12	<p>WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS Banjar Country: Indonesia Population: 4,082,000 Language: Banjar Main Religion: Islam Evangelical: 0.0-0.1%</p> <p>The Banjar people live on the southern coast of Kalimantan (the Indonesian part of Borneo). They tend to marry and settle near parents or relatives, seldom moving to other parts of Indonesia. They are devout Muslims, and Islam influences every aspect of their identity and daily life. Yet they hold on to traditional animistic beliefs of supernatural beings living in stones, trees, and mountains. The Banjar do not look positively on modern methods or technologies. They do not mix much with other groups and are suspicious of outsiders’ intentions. Pray that the Banjar would be open to hearing the Gospel. Pray for church planting efforts and that these fellowships of believers would flourish and grow. Pray that the Banjar would find their true identity in Christ, who is their Creator and Savior.</p>
Week 3:	JULY 13-17 – PRAY FOR MINISTRIES IN NORTH AFRICA/MIDDLE EAST
MON 13	PRAY for the Ephraim Project team as they seek to reach Persian-speakers with the Good News of Jesus in the midst of much uncertainty. Ask God to give these volunteers many more opportunities to share the hope that we have found through Jesus.
TUE 14	PRAISE God for the encouraging testimonies of what He is doing through our Arabic media partnership. Pray for the follow-up team as they disciple new believers and integrate them into church fellowships throughout the region.
WED 15	PRAY for our Arabic media partners as they create content to point people toward Jesus. Pray for the team of ministers as they prayerfully and lovingly respond to people who are genuinely searching for truth, as well as those who are completely antagonistic to the Gospel. Praise God that He can soften even the hardest of hearts. Pray that many Arabic-speakers would respond to Him.

THU 16	PRAISE God that our partners in Greece were able to resolve the issues they were having with using plastic injection molds as part of their Trash 2 Treasure plastic recycling system. Pray for this ministry that seeks to demonstrate to the Roma people how God can give new life and make something beautiful out of things that were broken and discarded.
FRI 17	PRAY for the Mbingo Baptist Hospital radiation therapy building project. Pray for Bill as he designs the complex air conditioning system needed for the radiation equipment to operate correctly. Praise God that a second radiotherapy machine from Wales has just been donated, along with the necessary funds to dismantle and ship it to Cameroon.
SAT & SUN 18-19	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS Tunisian Arab Country: Tunisia Population: 11,225,000 Language: Tunisian Arabic Main Religion: Islam Evangelical: 0.0-0.1% Tunisia has a rich history of Phoenician, Roman, and Byzantine culture. A strong Christian church was established there in the first few centuries after Christ, despite intense persecution from the Romans. Unfortunately, the church had all but disappeared by the 7th century. Today, virtually all Tunisian Arabs are Muslim. The country is largely secular, and many Tunisians seldom, if ever, go to a mosque. Tunisians place a high value on family. They are friendly and known for their hospitality. Nearly 40% of Tunisians are under the age of 25, and they are highly educated. The lack of employment in the country led to an overthrow of the government in 2011 and the beginning of the Arab Spring. Pray for God to strengthen, encourage, and multiply the small number of Tunisian Arab believers. Pray for the completion of Bible translation work in this language. Pray that entire Tunisian families would come to faith and choose to follow Jesus. Pray that God would establish churches in every city and village in the country.
Week 4:	JULY 20-24 – PRAY FOR REACH BEYOND MISSIONARIES AND STAFF
MON 20	PRAY for our many missionaries, staff, retirees, partners, and friends of the mission who are experiencing all sorts of medical issues and challenges. Pray for wisdom for those who are providing care. Ask God—the Great Physician—to bring healing and relief. Pray that each person, along with their families and loved ones, would see God’s grace and experience His peace.
TUE 21	PRAY for our people who are serving in leadership roles within Reach Beyond as well as with partner ministries around the world. Ask God to give each of these leaders His direction and wisdom as they make decisions and guide others.
WED 22	PRAY for the Reach Beyond missionaries who are on Home Ministry Assignment this summer. Pray that their churches and ministry partners would be encouraged by what God is doing. Ask God to give these missionaries great times with family and much-needed rest in the midst of what can be a very hectic season. Pray for several of the families who will also be visiting potential colleges for their children. Pray that God would give them wisdom and guide them to where they should go.
THU 23	PRAY for our missionaries, both active and retired, who are experiencing loss. Pray for David and Cathi, as their adult daughter Stephanie went to be with the Lord following a series of medical complications. Pray too for John, whose wife, Esther, “graduated to Heaven” after battling brain cancer for 20 months. Ask God to give them, and their families, His peace and comfort.
FRI 24	PRAY that God would send us more missionaries and volunteers who want to use their skills, abilities, and experiences to help reach the unreached with the Gospel and make disciples of every people, tribe, language, and nation.
SAT & SUN 25-26	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS Jat Country: India Population: 22,621,000 Language: Hindi Main Religion: Hinduism Evangelical: 0.0-0.1% A well-known Jat proverb says that men may come and men may go, but I go on forever. It has been said that no Jat wants to be ruled. They are brave, hardworking people who possess both the desire and ability to rule. The Jats are known for their military prowess. They place great pride in their ancestry and rarely marry people from other ethnic groups. As a people, they are typically taller and heavier than most of their neighbors, and are often feared by other communities. They can be found in all walks of life, including high academic and technical positions. Most Jats live in rural areas and are usually landowners. They are one of the most prosperous groups in India on a per-capita basis. The Jats are pragmatic Hindus who worship whatever gods will benefit them. They hold negative views of Christianity as they only see low-status people choosing to follow Jesus. Pray that influential members of the Jat community would believe in Christ and that they would boldly share the Gospel with their people.
Week 5:	JULY 27-31 – PRAY FOR THE MINISTRY OF SHARE ENGLISH
MON 27	PRAISE God for the global impact of Share English. Last year, English learners downloaded over 2.2 million audio files, and there were over 1.4 million video views. Many of these users are in countries where traditional missionary efforts are not allowed.
TUE 28	PRAY that God would provide more volunteers to serve as English conversation club leaders for online or in-person groups. We have opportunities for any follower of Jesus who speaks English to serve about an hour per week, for six weeks. Quick online training is provided. Learn more at: ReachBeyond.org/ShareEnglish
WED 29	PRAY for the Share English team as they produce audio programs, videos, and companion materials that engage English learners and naturally open doors for conversations about spiritual things and point them to the hope that we have in Jesus.
THU 30	PRAY that God would send more part-time and full-time missionaries to join this ministry in various roles. Ask God to also provide us with people to serve as English Club Coordinators in various regions and countries around the world.
FRI 31	PRAISE God for each person who has come to know Jesus through the online and in-person English conversation clubs. Ask God to lead more people to join in Share English’s ministry through prayer, leading a club, or with financial support.
