

JOIN US IN PRAYER – JUNE 2026

Week 1: JUNE 1-5 – PRAY FOR MINISTRIES IN ASIA PACIFIC	
MON 1	PRAY for Janice during the next two weeks as she equips and encourages our radio partners in Indonesia. Ask God to protect her as she travels. Pray that He will give her the words to say as she teaches and mentors on-air presenters and station staff to more effectively use radio and digital media to share the Good News of Jesus in their communities.
TUE 2	PRAY for one of our Thai partner radio stations after a dearly loved presenter tragically passed into the Lord's presence in May. Ask God to give the family and the staff comfort as they mourn. Pray too that God will encourage our radio partners and give them wisdom and strength as they continue on with the ministry and seek to close the gap that was left behind.
WED 3	PRAISE God for what He has done over the years through our partnership with church-planting believers in Indonesia. Give thanks that He has allowed us to help them use radio to reach so many people with the Gospel. Pray for them as they hold their annual conference this month. Ask God to renew, refresh, and recharge them for the ministry He has called them to do.
THU 4	PRAISE God for several short-term workers who have helped our team with various projects in the region. Ask God to also send us full-time workers who are passionate about serving alongside local believers to reach this whole region with the Gospel.
FRI 5	PRAY for Jamali, who listens to one of our partner radio stations as he serves his customers in a market from morning until evening. He says the words he hears over the air remind him that even when he is tired, God never leaves him. Pray for Jamali and his family as they want to be a light shining in the middle of that marketplace.
SAT & SUN 6-7	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS Java Pesisir Lor Country: Indonesia Population: 38,479,000 Language: Javanese Main Religion: Islam Evangelical: 0.0-0.1% The Java Pesisir Lor are a distinctive people group living in the north-central part of Java Island. Most are farmers or fishermen, but many are seeking urban occupations throughout Indonesia. The Pesisir Lor's diet consists of a variety of spiced rice and soybean-cake dishes with vegetables, along with an occasional egg or bit of meat that is served with tea or coffee. Nearly all Pesisir Lor people profess to be Sunni Muslims, but Sufi mystical beliefs are widely practiced. The Pesisir Lor travel throughout the year to the burial site of two men who introduced Islam to the island many centuries ago. At these graves, the Pesisir Lor venerate and ask the ancient spirits for health, salvation, and sustenance. Pray for Christians who are working to plant churches in this part of Indonesia. Pray that the Pesisir Lor would find true salvation through faith in Jesus.
Week 2: JUNE 8-12 – PRAY FOR THE MINISTRIES OF HCJB ECUADOR	
MON 8	PRAISE God for HCJB Ecuador's 3rd annual Digital Missions conference last month. One hundred young adults came to HCJB for two days to learn from 15 different speakers and workshop leaders about using digital media in ministry and missions. HCJB Ecuador has been offering this conference because they see the importance of empowering Christians to engage others with high-quality communications content and equipping them to utilize new technologies.
TUE 9	PRAY for HCJB's renewed application for three new FM stations in Ecuador. The proposed FM repeaters are for cities that do not have Christian radio and where people have asked HCJB to put a station. Last year, all application processes in the country were canceled because of procedural problems, so pray that God would help each of our applications to be granted this year.
WED 10	PRAY for HCJB's ministry and growing presence on YouTube and social media. The team is making more and more video content, and their audience seems to be responding well. Visit Radio HCJB's channel at https://www.youtube.com/@radiohcjb and website at https://hcjb.org/ (both in Spanish).
THU 11	PRAISE God for His faithfulness as Radio HCJB celebrates 95 years of ministry in Ecuador. Give thanks for every person from around the world who has prayed and generously supported this ministry over the years. Praise God for the many believers from Ecuador who are now helping support the ongoing operations of HCJB.
FRI 12	PRAY for the HCJB team as they prepare and make plans for the Quito Day concerts later this year. The team has to find another venue for the concerts, since complications arose for the weekend they had planned. These concerts are held at the start of the Christmas season and provide a wonderful opportunity to share how God demonstrated His love by sending Jesus — the Savior of the world — with people who may not even listen to the station.
SAT & SUN 13-14	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS Sama Sindhi Country: Pakistan Population: 1,630,000 Language: Sindhi Main Religion: Islam Evangelical: 0.0-0.1% The Sama Sindhi are a group of Muslims in Pakistan, who moved from India during the partition of 1947. All Sindhi were originally Hindu or Buddhist until the early 8th century, when many converted to Islam. The Sama Sindhi claim to be descendants of the Samma Dynasty who once ruled over the Indus Valley and West India. The Sindhi, unlike other Muslims, tend to organize society in castes based on clan and occupation, and do not marry outside their caste. Rural Sindhi combine Muslim and Hindu practices with traditional beliefs in folk spirits. Ask God to open doors for believers to go, work, live, and share the Gospel among them. Pray that the Sama Sindhi would have opportunities to hear the Gospel, and that many would choose to follow Him.

Week 3: JUNE 15-19 – PRAY FOR MINISTRIES IN EUROPE/EURASIA	
MON 15	PRAISE God for a recent medical caravan that went to a rural area of a Gospel-restrictive country. The three days of clinics were held in two different places and were organized and done in partnership with a local church. Give thanks that the team was able to demonstrate Jesus and give compassionate care to 334 patients during 486 total consultations.
TUE 16	PRAISE God for the successful construction of a large greenhouse with our ministry partner One Heart in Greece. It will be used to grow food for feeding refugees, for training in employment skills, and as a therapeutic green space to assist refugees recovering from physical, emotional, and psychological trauma.
WED 17	PRAY for the home-based end-of-life care ministry that two of our missionaries started in a Gospel-restrictive place. Pray for the missionaries as they go on Home Ministry Assignment this summer, and for the two local believers who will continue the ministry while they are gone. Ask God to open up more opportunities for them to personally share the hope they've found in Jesus.
THU 18	PRAY for our partner One Heart in Greece as they use different outreaches to share the hope of Jesus with asylum seekers and refugees from the Middle East. Pray that they would receive government approvals to remodel and expand their medical clinic.
FRI 19	PRAY for the Balkan media team as they continue production on dubbing episodes of "In Touch with Dr. Charles Stanley" for a seventh season. Praise God for the many encouraging responses from viewers who have been blessed very much! Pray for two editors who have recently joined the project and are working hard to catch up and integrate with the rest of the production team.
SAT & SUN 20-21	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS Qizilbash Country: Afghanistan Population: 337,000 Language: Dari Main Religion: Islam Evangelical: 0.0-0.1% The Qizilbash are descendants of the Azeri Turk tribe that originated in the regions of Anatolia and Azerbaijan. The Qizilbash came into Afghanistan in 1738, when they were serving as troops during the India campaign of Iranian ruler Nadir Shah Afshar. Today, the Qizilbash live in the major urban centers as well as in the villages of central Afghanistan. They are craftsmen and tradesmen who have historically held important roles in government and continue to have important political influence on society. They adhere to Twelver Shia Islam as taught by sheikhs Haydar and his son Isma'il. They believe that their rulers are divine beings; thus, other orthodox Shias would consider them to be extremists. Pray for laborers to come and serve among the Qizilbash and to stand in the gap and intercede for their people. Pray that they would see that Jesus is Lord—the one true King—and that He would be exalted among them. Pray for a strong local church to be planted among the Qizilbash people.
Week 4: JUNE 22-26 – PRAY FOR REACH BEYOND MISSIONARIES AND STAFF	
MON 22	PRAY for our many missionaries, staff, retirees, partners, and friends of the mission who are experiencing serious medical issues and/or life challenges. Ask God to give them relief from their pain, whether physical or emotional. Pray for wisdom for those who are making decisions and providing care. Pray for God's healing and comfort, and that His will would be done in every situation.
TUE 23	PRAY for the Ephraim Project team as they continue to engage with Persian-speakers during very uncertain times. Ask God to guide and give the volunteers wisdom as they seek opportunities to share the hope that can only be found through Jesus.
WED 24	PRAY for our missionaries who are going on Home Ministry Assignment this summer. Pray that they would inspire and encourage churches and partners as they share what God is doing. Ask God to help them develop new prayer and financial support as needed. Pray too that the Lord would use them to help mobilize others to go and help share Jesus among unreached peoples.
THU 25	PRAY for our people who are overseeing Reach Beyond's efforts in North Africa and the Middle East. Ask God to give them direction as they seek His will. Pray that God will lead us to the person He would choose to serve as director of that region.
FRI 26	PRAY that God would send us more missionaries and volunteers who are ready to use their skills, abilities, and experiences to help reach the unreached with the Gospel and make disciples of every nation.
SAT & SUN 27-28	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UNREACHED PEOPLE GROUPS Hawrami Gurani Country: Iran Population: 233,000 Language: Gurani Main Religion: Islam Evangelical: 0.0-0.1% The Gurani live in the region of northern Iran and Iraq known as Kurdistan. They are often categorized as Kurds, but are actually an Iranian ethnic group comprised of the Bajelani and the Hawrami. The Gurani were most likely originally located near the Caspian Sea and were assimilated by the expansion of the Kurdish population. They were able to retain their language and their reputation for their military qualities. As such, they have provided a regiment of soldiers for the Persian army. The Gurani are farmers who raise cattle and alternate between living on the plains and the high mountain pastures based on the season. The Gurani are Muslim and devoted to the five pillars of Islam. Pray that they would encounter the Good Shepherd who knows them and cares for them. Pray that they would accept Christ and see transformation in their families and communities.
Week 5: JUNE 29-30 – PRAY FOR MINISTRIES IN SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA	
MON 29	PRAY for Alfred as he supports a radio ministry in a remote border community in South Sudan. The station experienced some catastrophic technical failures, which have taken it off the air. Ask God to help Alfred as he works to resolve these issues.
TUE 30	PRAISE God for enabling 15 national partners to participate in the well drilling, pump installation, and maintenance training that we provided in partnership with Friends in Action International. Pray for these believers as they utilize their new skills to provide clean water and to demonstrate and share the Gospel in places that can be very hostile towards followers of Jesus.
