Week 1:	NOVEMBER 4-10 – PRAY FOR MINISTRY IN SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA
MON <b>4</b>	PRAISE God for the many years of leadership that Lee and Michelle Sonius gave to the Sub-Saharan Africa Region. We are thankful for their years of service and the impact they have made on many lives. Pray for God's blessings on the Sonius' in their next journey. Pray for a smooth transition, and wisdom and discernment for Alex as he becomes the new Regional Director. Pray that God would give unity and encouragement to the new team.
TUE 5	PRAY for a partner in a troubled part of Cameroon who has been waiting on a radio license for two years. Pray for perseverance with the authorities and for God's favor to allow the license to be granted quickly.
WED 6	PRAY for Joseph Kebbie as he is preparing to travel to do follow-up training with our radio partners. Pray that he will have wisdom and discernment in helping partners with all of their training needs.
тни <b>7</b>	PRAISE God for the progress on a new recording studio in Burkina Faso that will reach out to the Fulani. Pray that it will soon be complete and ready for our team to begin training.
FRI 8	PRAY for the new Christian radio station that was installed in Northern Togo in August, in a very strategic, yet difficult location. The station began broadcasting to the area's unreached populations, but has since come under attack from authorities, who decided not to recognize the new station. Pray for the station manager, who is working with authorities to sort out the misunderstanding. Pray that the station would be able to resume broadcasts without much delay or expense. Pray for our partner, a local pastor who is proclaiming the Good News throughout the region.
SAT & SUN 9-10	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UPGs   PRAY for the Oromo Garre Country: Kenya   Population: 886,000   Language: Garre   Main Religion: Islam   Evangelical: 0.01% The Garre are a sub-tribe of a much larger ethnic group known as the Somali. Those living in Kenya are concentrated mainly in the Wajiir and Mandera districts. Most of the Garre are nomadic herders. They live in portable huts made of bent saplings that are covered with animal skins or woven mats; the women live in separate huts. Villages are made up of several related families. The Somali tribes were converted to Islam in the 1400s. Today, the Garre are virtually all Shafiite Muslims. They are very orthodox in their religious practices. In recent years, the northeastern regions of Africa have suffered from severe drought. Healthcare facilities are also insufficien to meet the needs of the people. Pray that God would send workers to the Garre to meet their physical and spiritual needs.
Week 2:	NOVEMBER 11-17 – PRAY FOR MINISTRY IN CREATIVE ACCESS COUNTRIES
моn 11	PRAY for our missionaries living and working in creative access countries. Pray for patience as they live in challenging locations, and wisdom for how to share the hope of Christ in these areas.
TUE 12	PRAISE God for a believer and medical student in a closed access country who wants to continue her training under our medical staff.  Pray she will use what she is learning to go back and practice medicine in her hometown and be a light among her people.
WED 13	PRAISE God for new opportunities to serve remote villages in a closed access country through medical caravans. Praise God that pastors and counselors have been able to join these caravans to minister to the emotional, mental and spiritual needs of the people.
тни <b>14</b>	PRAISE God for the opportunity our doctors have to train and mentor a group of young medical students in a creative access country. Pra for wisdom for our missionaries as they discern how to disciple these young believers. Pray the students would grow in their faith.
FRI 15	PRAISE God for a successful medical caravan into a new, remote village, and the new relationships that were built. Pray that trust would continue to grow so that our teams could continue to work there.
SAT & SUN 16-17	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UPGs   PRAY for the Adi Andhra Country: India   Population: 318,000   Language: Telegu   Main Religion: Hinduism   Evangelical: Unknown The Adi Andhra are a Scheduled caste of people living in south India. A Scheduled caste means that they are disadvantaged and victim of past discrimination. As of 2001 only about 60% of the Adi Andhra could read and write at a basic level. Today most Adi Andhra are still landless, rural farm workers. Some also work as street sweepers, village watchmen and in the leather trade. The Adi Andhra give attention to the Hindu goddesses who they believe can protect them from epidemics, evil spirits and famine. Pray that they would come to know the one true God who can give them physical and spiritual healing.

Week 3:	NOVEMBER 18-24 – PRAY FOR MINISTRY IN ASIA PACIFIC
мон 18	<b>PRAISE</b> God for the partner medical clinic in the Rohingya refugee camps in Bangladesh. They have been serving an average of 80 patients per day since May of 2018. Pray that Jesus will continue to draw these people to Himself.
TUE 19	PRAY for areas of Bangladesh that were hit hard by flooding in July, as they now rebuild. Reach Beyond is helping with the efforts to restore homes in some of the badly affected areas
WED <b>20</b>	PRAISE God for the time Toffer King could spend encouraging radio partners in Nepal. He was able to provide technical help to four stations to help them continue their community radio outreach.
тни <b>21</b>	<b>PRAISE</b> God for the completion of 10 safe drinking wells (each serving 10 families) in Indonesia, as part of the rebuilding efforts following a devastating earthquake in the central part of the country.
FRI <b>22</b>	PRAY as Janice continues to develop an online version of our Introductory Radio Training course, to be piloted in Indonesia.
SAT & SUN 23-24	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UPGs   PRAY for the French Jew Country: France   Population: 453,000   Language: French   Main Religion: Ethnic Religions   Evangelical: 0% Jews represent the oldest monotheistic religion. The Jews of Europe arrived on the continent at least 2,000 years ago during the early days of the Roman empire. Since then, they have been a significant influence in the history and culture of Europe. Much of what is considered "Jewish" today finds its roots among the European Jews. For religious Jews, God is the Supreme Being, the Creator of the universe, and the ultimate Judge of human affairs. Beyond this, the religious beliefs of the Jewish communities vary greatly. European Jews are extremely diverse in religious practice. The Jews have a wonderful understanding of their connection with the Abrahamic covenant. However, they also have a history of rejecting Jesus Christ as Messiah, the one who has fulfilled that covenant. Pray that as the Gospel is shared, it will not be viewed as anti-Semitic, but rather as the fulfillment of what God promised through Abraham centuries ago.

мон <b>25</b>	PRAISE God for a successful and an encouraging leadership training program in October. Twenty-four Mongolian leaders met with Reach Beyond global ambassador Ron Cline, Asia Pacific staff David and Lisa, and other national faculty. Together, they grew deeper in their practices of Biblical leadership.
TUE 26	PRAISE God for our missionary appointees who were commissioned last month in ceremony at the Colorado office. Pray for Brendon and Kathryn, Ray and Kitty, Sam and Josie, and Rachel as they continue their support raising and prepare to go into the field. Pray that God would give them wisdom, encouragement and strength.
WED <b>27</b>	PRAISE God for the board members of World Radio Missionary Fellowship Inc, dba Reach Beyond, and successful board meetings held at the beginning of the month. SAT & SUN <b>30-1</b>	WEEKEND PRAYER FOR UPGs   PRAY for the Kuy Country: Thailand   Population: 420,000   Language: Kuay   Main Religion: Buddhism   Evangelical: 0.41% The Kuy are mostly poor wet rice farmers. Farming is labor intensive, plowing with cows or water buffalo, and transporting goods by oxcart. The Kuy have an oral culture with high illiteracy. For most, education is only available for two or three years. Their beliefs are a mixture of animist and Folk Buddhist ideas with animism being the older and more dominant belief structure. The Kuy have little access to good health care. Pray for committed Thai believers to bring the Good News to these people.
